the past cookie cutter safety and risk management mentality through teaching Soldiers "how to think" rather than telling them "what to think." This manual expands the context of the original FM by focusing on the application of composite risk management to the military decisionmaking process (MDMP) and the Army training management system. It further assigns the responsibilities for conducting risk management training during initial entry training and professional military education.
