When western nations become under threat from internal strife and foriegn powers, the fear of losing these privileges and securities become central to the congregational conversation, usurping the Gospel message of the of true freedom and security in Jesus Christ.

Throughout he argues that cultural critiques of racism and imperialism, the twin chains of Babylon of the title, informed the construction of a multiethnic Asian American identity committed to interracial and transnational solidarity.
