4. How important is proper citation in a journal article critique? Extremely important. All claims and information must be properly cited to avoid plagiarism and to give credit to the original authors.
5. Where can I find more examples of journal article critiques? University libraries and online academic databases often have sample critiques available. Look for examples relevant to your field of study.
