

example he explained that God's name was Iehouah because in Hebrew this name was close to the name of Iesuah (Jesus), or Iehosuah, which means Iehouah is salvation. He also knew that according to Paulus de Heredia, a Christian Cabbalist, the meaning of God's name was He causes to be (yehauueh), but he never confused the pronunciation of God's name with its Kabbalistic meaning (yehaweh). For Servetus, Iehouah was the only true God.
