and the problems of public trials and courtroom security in terrorism prosecutions; the history and development of the law of armed conflict and U.S. war powers, the deployment of armed forces against terrorist organizations, and the use of military force against foreign nations in response to terrorist attacks or to preempt terrorism; the background of military detention and trial as an incident of war, the evolving law of military detention for terrorism suspects and its application to Guant++namo, and the use of military commissions to try alleged terrorists; and the use of targeted killings as a counter-terrorism policy and the legal implications in the war on terror. Understanding the Law of Terrorism thus offers jurists and practitioners a basic appreciation of an emerging sphere of law with increasing importance across disciplines, while also serving pedagogical purposes for teachers and students interested in exploring the impact of a highly provocative subject and the resulting interactions among seemingly distinct fields of law.
