Remittance-dependent households and exporters saw a drop in their purchasing power, and Haiti's net external buffers were adversely affected. Following from these findings, the paper offers recommendations on ways to facilitate foreign exchange management and boost external sustainability while contributing to the central bank's overall policy objectives.
